Day One

Mid-day arrival at LAX. Meet your **local guide and deluxe motor coach.**

Transfer to your hotel in the suburbs of LA.

Hotel: Hampton Inn/ Holiday Inn Express or similar

Mid afternoon: Depart for the **Hollywood & Highland Center.**

The Hollywood & Highland Center, an entertainment, retail and hotel complex at Hollywood Boulevard and Highland Avenue in the Hollywood district in Los Angeles. The 387,000-square-foot center also includes the Grauman's Chinese Theatre and the Kodak Theatre, home to the Academy Awards, a popular spot to snap a photo.



Spend the rest of your afternoon and evening here. You will see the **Kodak Theatre Walk**, have a **guided tour Kodak Theatre** and see the **famous Hollywood Sign**. **The Hollywood Sign**, now recognized around the globe for its ties to the movie business, originally read "HOLLYWOODLAND" and was created in 1923 to advertise a new housing development in the hills above the Hollywood district of Los Angeles. It was never intended to be a permanent fixture on these hills, but after the rise of the American cinema in Los Angeles the sign became an internationally recognized symbol and landmark, and continues to make frequent appearances in

popular culture. The bridge on the 3rd and 4th levels of the Hollywood & Highland center offer visitors the city's best view of the Hollywood Sign and a great photo opportunity.



Kodak Theatre Walk serves as the entrance to the world-famous Kodak Theatre on the west side of Hollywood & Highland Center. Since opening in November 2001, the Kodak Theatre has been the permanent home of the Academy Awards®. Guests arrive by limousine on Hollywood Blvd. where a red carpet and velvet rope walkway awaits them. The walk up the red carpet on Oscar®'s night takes celebrities through Kodak Theatre Walk, an impressive art deco inspired walkway with golden framed crystal plaques commemorating each of the Academy's Best Picture winners since 1929.



When you visit Hollywood & Highland Center, you can you imagine the feel of red carpet beneath your feet as you stroll the same path that the stars take on Oscar® night .

Kodak Theatre Tour - The 3,332 seat Kodak Theatre, located in the heart of the Hollywood & Highland Center, opened in November 2001 and soon thereafter became known to more than one billion people across the globe as the first permanent home of the glamorous Academy Awards®. As a first class live entertainment venue, Kodak Theatre has hosted a wide range of prestigious artists and events including Celine Dion, Prince, Elvis Costello, Stevie Wonder, American Ballet Theatre and various touring Broadway productions.



A 30-minute guided theatre tours offers visitors highlights of the world-renowned venue, starting with the five-level theatre lobby and grand spiral staircase as well as a glimpse of Hollywood's biggest night – the Oscars®.

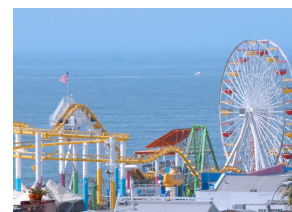

PIER 39's two-level design with lush landscaping is a must-see on San Francisco's historic waterfront. There's a multitude of fun for everyone with attractions and live entertainment to amuse all ages.

The City of Mt. Shasta, nestled at the foot of imposing 14,162-foot Mount Shasta (4,317 m), is surrounded by natural beauty and offers many year-round outdoor activities. The mountain is the second highest volcano in the continental United States and has been a prominent landmark along the historic Siskiyou Trail — the track of an ancient trade and travel route of Native American footpaths between California's Central Valley and the Pacific Northwest. Today's version of the Siskiyou Trail is Interstate 5, which provides easy access to the City of Mt. Shasta, located midway between San Francisco and Portland, Oregon.

Travel to Portland, OR where you will visit the **University of Portland**. As of the 2011-12 academic year, some 3,800 University of Portland students and approximately 320 faculty members are engaged in teaching and research on the campus founded in 1901 and once on the edge of the American wilderness. The University has been ranked 17 years consecutively in the top ten for western regional universities by U.S. News & World Report, and in Barron's Best Buys as one of the best teaching universities in the West.



It also has been ranked by Bloomberg BusinessWeek as the best return on investment for any university in Oregon and for five consecutive years has been on the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll. In 2011, the University of Portland was named the top producer of Fulbright scholars in the nation among "master's universities" for the second consecutive year, according to the Chronicle of Higher Education. The University had 10 alumni win the prestigious grants to work and study abroad for 2011-12. This was the second top national ranking the University received in as many months – Washington Monthly ranked the University number one nationally among peer institutions for its commitment to community service.

Hotel: Courtyard, Seattle Downtown

Evening: **Included dinner** and a visit to the **Observation Deck of the Space Needle.**

The Space Needle is a tower in Seattle, Washington and is a major landmark of the Pacific Northwest region of the United States and a symbol of Seattle. Located at the Seattle Center, it was built for the 1962 World's Fair, during which time nearly 20,000 people a day used the elevators, with over 2.3 million visitors in all for the World Fair. The Space Needle is 605 feet (184 m) high at its highest point and 138 feet (42 m) wide at its widest point and weighs 9,550 tons. When it was completed it was the tallest structure west of the Mississippi River. It is built to withstand winds of up to 200 miles per hour (89 m/s) and earthquakes of up to 9.1 magnitude, which would protect the structure against an earthquake as powerful as the 1700 Cascadia earthquake. The tower also has 25 lightning rods on its roof to prevent lightning damage.



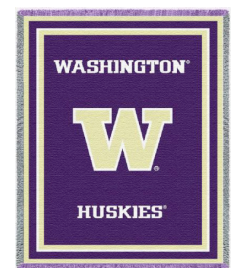
The Space Needle features an observation deck at 520 feet (160 m), and a gift shop with the rotating SkyCity restaurant at 500 feet (150 m). From the top of the Needle, one can see not only the Downtown Seattle skyline, but also the Olympic and Cascade Mountains, Mount Rainier, Mount Baker, Elliott Bay and surrounding islands. Photographs of the Seattle skyline often show the Space Needle in a prominent position, even appearing to tower above the rest of the city's skyscrapers, as well as Mount Rainier in the background. This occurs because the tower, which is equivalent in height to a 60-story building, stands more than a kilometer northwest of most downtown skyscrapers

Watch the market fishmongers toss around salmon, visit the first Starbucks Coffee Shop, enjoy the music and antics of talented street performers, and soak in the unique ambiance of Seattle's most popular attraction. This nine-acre historic district hosts over 10 million visitors each year.

Late afternoon visit: **Tillicum Village**. Your 4-hour adventure begins with an Argosy cruise on Puget Sound to Blake Island. On the island, you will enjoy an appetizer of clams and nectar and will enter the longhouse for a buffet meal including salmon baked on cedar stakes in the traditional Northwest Coast Indian style. As you finish your meal, the lights dim for an enchanting show performed in the spirit of Northwest Coast Indians. With authentic art and totems, Native dance and storytelling, and a historic setting, your students will discover, explore and experience history as it comes alive!
