Overview of the Program:

Travel with Navsar to the heart of India, to the state of Madhya Pradesh. We start in Indore, where we travel to the banks of the river Narmada, to the town of Maheshwar, where every house resonates with the sound of the shuttle of a handloom, weaving exquisite Maheshwari sarees which are now known all over the world. Moving onwards to Bhopal, the capital of Madhya Pradesh, the group will visit the prehistoric cave paintings, the oldest in Asia, in Bhimbhetka. See the same motifs spring up on the canvases of the vernacular artists from this region who trace their roots to these ancient civilizations. We next move to Sanchi, to the best-preserved Buddhist site in the world, which was built by Emperor Ashoka in 2nd Century B.C. The gateways of Sanchi narrate the tales of various Boddhisatavas through their numerous incarnations. Visit the Mughals, in their capital city of Agra and see the sunrise at the Taj Mahal. Towards the end of your trip, get an insight into Sanjhi, the art of paper cutting by National Award winning craftsmen, at their studio in Mathura. Once, back in Delhi, experience and feel the secular world of India with an art historian and an overview of the city's contemporary art scene.

Tour Highlights:

Indore:

-Visit the textile looms in Maheshwar, on the banks of the river Narmada.

Bhopal:

- -See the pre-historic cave paintings of Bhimbhetka made over a thousand years ago.
- -Meditate at Sanchi, the oldest and best-preserved Buddhist site.
- -Interact with a folk artist and learn their craft (or maybe teach them yours!)

Agra

-The symmetrical beauty of the Taj Mahal is best viewed at sunrise.

Mathura:

-Visit National Award craftsmen who still practice an age-old craft of paper cutting.

Delhi:

- -A chronological tour of the city of Delhi, tracing its history.
- -Early morning bicycle ride through the labyrinth of alleys of Old Delhi.
- -Experience secular India with an eminent art historian through visits to various spiritual sites.



Day by Day Sequence of our Tour*:

Day 1: Arrival in New Delhi and a brief orientation by Navsar

Day 2: Orientation in New Delhi. Visit the Arts and Crafts Museums and Craft Bazaars. Leave for Indore on an overnight train

Day 3. Visit the textile looms at Maheshwar and the temple of Ahilya Bai, on the banks of the river Narmada

Day 4: Leave for Bhopal to see the pre-historic cave paintings of Bhimbhetka. Visit a Gond artist

Day 5: Explore Sanchi- the best preserved Buddhist monument from 2nd Cent BC

Day 6: Visit the famous museums of Bhopal including the Bharat Bhawan and the Museum of Mankind

Day 7: Take the day off, regroup your thoughts and fill in your notebooks

Day 8: Leave for Agra and visit the old Mughal capital of Fatehpur Sikri

Day 9: Visit the Taj Mahal and the Agra Fort

Day 10: A Demonstration by a National Award winning Sanjhi Paper Cutting Artist

Day 11: Arrive in New Delhi and visit contemporary art spaces

Day 12: Understand the religions of India with a known art historian

Day 13: A chronological tour of Delhi's best monuments

Day 14: Departure

*Itineraries change depending upon the arrival dates of the group. A detailed itinerary will be provided on request. This tour requires an advance booking of two months to ensure confirmed reservations on trains.

Accommodation:

The accommodation varies from city to city. All our hotels are comfortable with twin beds and running hot and cold water. Some hotel may also provide free Internet. A general rating of our hotels in 3 stars

Transportation:

The Pre-Historic to Post Independence India Tour is conducted in air-conditioned railways coach between cities. For local transport, you will experience travel in cars, cycle and auto rickshaws, bicycle and even on foot.

Meals:

The Pre-Historic to Post Independence India Tour includes breakfast. Lunch and Dinner are not included.

Inclusions:

The tour cost includes accommodation, breakfast, pickup/drop from airport, guided tours and transportation between and within cities.

The tour DOES NOT include lunch and dinner, admission to museums and monuments, tips and any camera charges


