Tour and information session at the **University of Texas at San Antonio** - With more than 28,400 students enrolled in 131 undergraduate and graduate degree programs, UTSA is the second-largest component in The University of Texas System and has been one of the state's fastest-growing public universities for much of the last decade. UTSA offers 64 bachelor's, 46 master's and 21 doctoral degree programs. The university's three campuses provide access and opportunity for large numbers of historically underserved students. More than 56 percent of UTSA's students come from groups underrepresented in higher education.

Founded by the Society of Mary in 1852, St. Mary's is the oldest Catholic university in Texas and the Southwest. With a diverse student population of nearly 4,000, St. Mary's is home to five schools: Humanities and Social Sciences; Science, Engineering and Technology; Bill Greehey School of Business; Graduate; and Law.*

Today the campus consists of 225 buildings on a 457-acre main campus and 4,777 additional acres in recreational, instructional, farm and ranch land.

UT Austin has an enrollment of 11,000 students and more than 3,500 master's and doctor's degrees awarded annually. More than 8,700 bachelor's degrees are awarded annually in more than 170 fields of study and 100 majors.

Guided tour and information session at **Paul Quinn College** - Paul Quinn - founded by a small group of African Methodist Episcopal preachers in Austin, Texas on April 4, 1872. The school's original purpose was to educate freed slaves and their offspring. In 1877, the College moved from Austin to Waco, Texas, and was renamed Waco College. Later, renamed for **Bishop William Paul Quinn, A.M.E.** and is now in Dallas. The school has under 1,000 students of which 700 can be accommodated in on campus housing. The 130-acre campus is in an urban area 12 miles from downtown Dallas. Including residence halls there are 8 buildings.
